

This is Allie, our parlimentary guide for the Gr 9-12 live class at the House of Commons. What a time!










Grade 5 students Khensani (left) and Michael (right) made family crests for Art. They did a beautiful job using symbolic imagery to demonstrate their family cultures.

Awesome shading on your still life art project, Isaiah (Grade 6)! It looks so lifelike!






Look at the super detailed still life that Taehue Kwak in Grade 4 drew and coloured. This is very impressive and beautiful! Grade 9 Science students have
