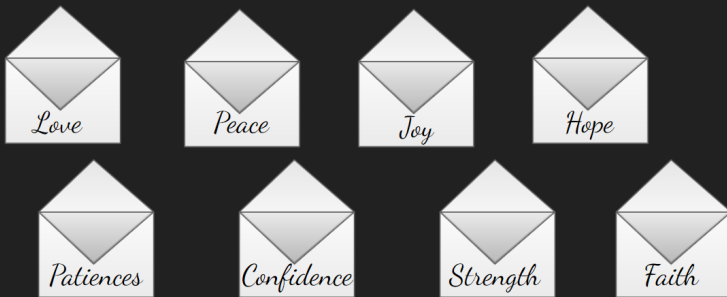

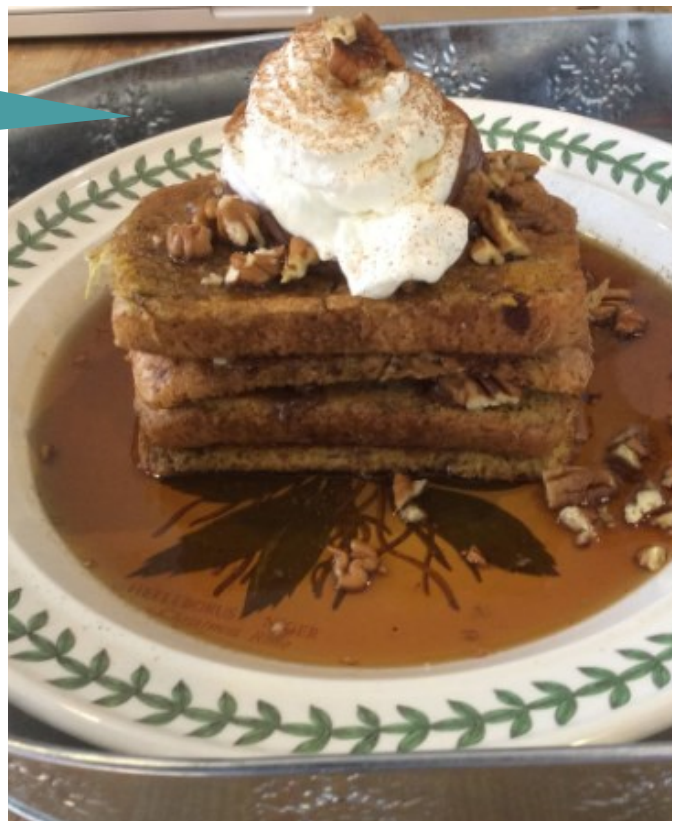
Take what you need
