
public for our school! On the next page of the Quest, you will hear thoughts from our students and staff as they reflected on this amazing field trip. Like Mike, may we all

> Mike's ideas and faith were very nonviolent. That reminds me of Christianity in a way. - Levi


I felt such a peace listening to his stories. He is wonderful. Thank you! -Rozy

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


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
