



Mackenzie King Orders Overseas Conscription

Last Wednesday, November 22, Prime Minister William Lyon Mackenzie King reversed his position at the Canadian Parliament, after General A.G.L. McNaughton failed to find volunteered National Resources Mobilization Act (NRMA) men. King have said that conscription was unnecessary considering the risk of national dissension. King said if the troops were to serve overseas, it "would occasion the most serious controversy that could rise in Canada. I can think of no course fraught with greater danger to our war effort, to say nothing of the unity and strength of Canada today and for generations to come, than a general election at this late stage of the war on the conscription issue. Until it is apparent conscription for overseas forces is necessary, the government would not be justified in taking the risk of widespread national dissension." Mutiny Breaks In Terrace, British Columbia

On Friday, November 24, a mutiny began in Terrace, British Columbia, where the 15th Canadian Infantry Brigade of Pacific Command is stationed. According to Major General George Pearkes, soldiers disobeyed the officers and seized weapons after hearing rumours of conscripts being deployed overseas. The number of men involved in the mutiny is estimated to be between 1500-3000 men. Many of the soldiers at the 15th Canadian Infantry Brigade of Pacific Command is French Canadians. Terrace is a northwest town with around 500 residents. November 24, 1944, Johnson McArthur

The same day mutiny began in Terrace, British Columbia, around 1000 soldiers from the Vernon Military Camp marched through Vernon protesting "Down with conscription." November 24, 1944, Annie Baker

Chaloult Says Quebec Should Secede From Canada

During a meeting on Tuesday, November 28, French Canadian nationalist said "Quebec should secede from Canada if the province was not allowed to decide its own policies on conscriptions." French Canadians are expressing their opposition as Prime Minister William Lyon Mackenzie King agreed on overseas conscription of 17,000 NRMA men. November 28, 1944, Diana O'Brien
