telling someone something bad

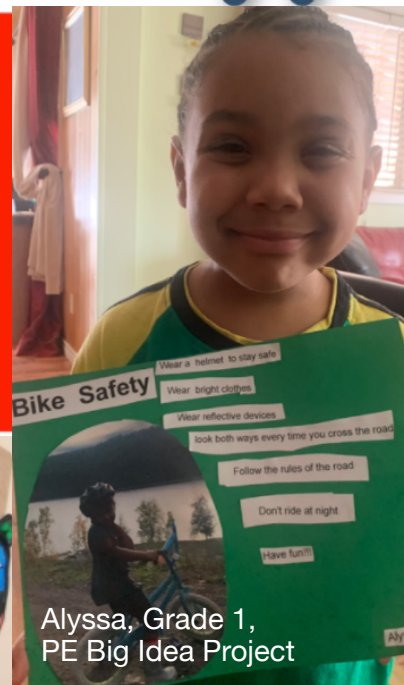
**Bystander:**

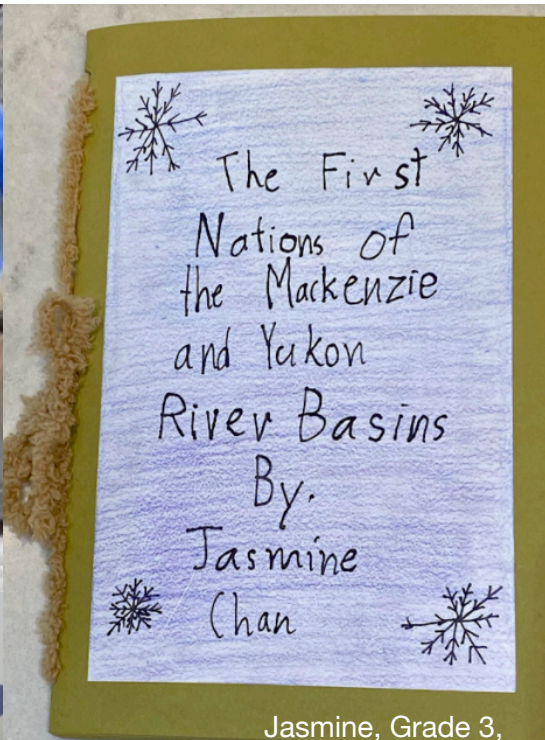

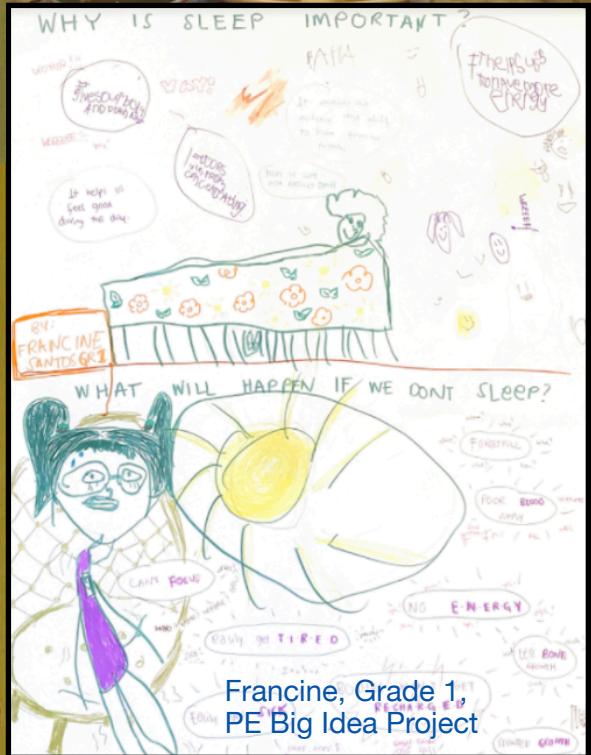
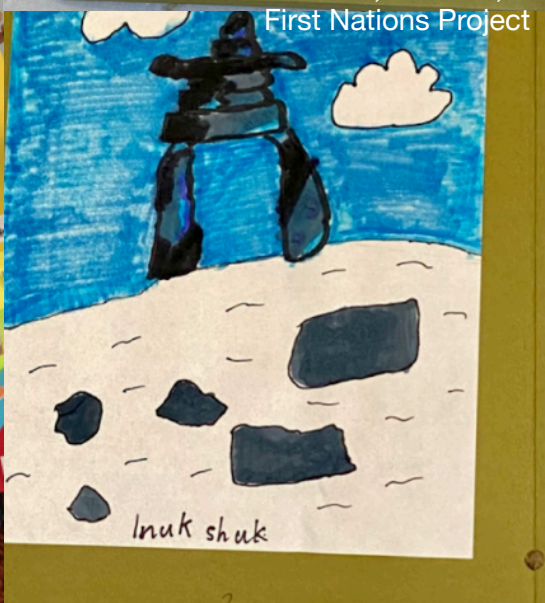
