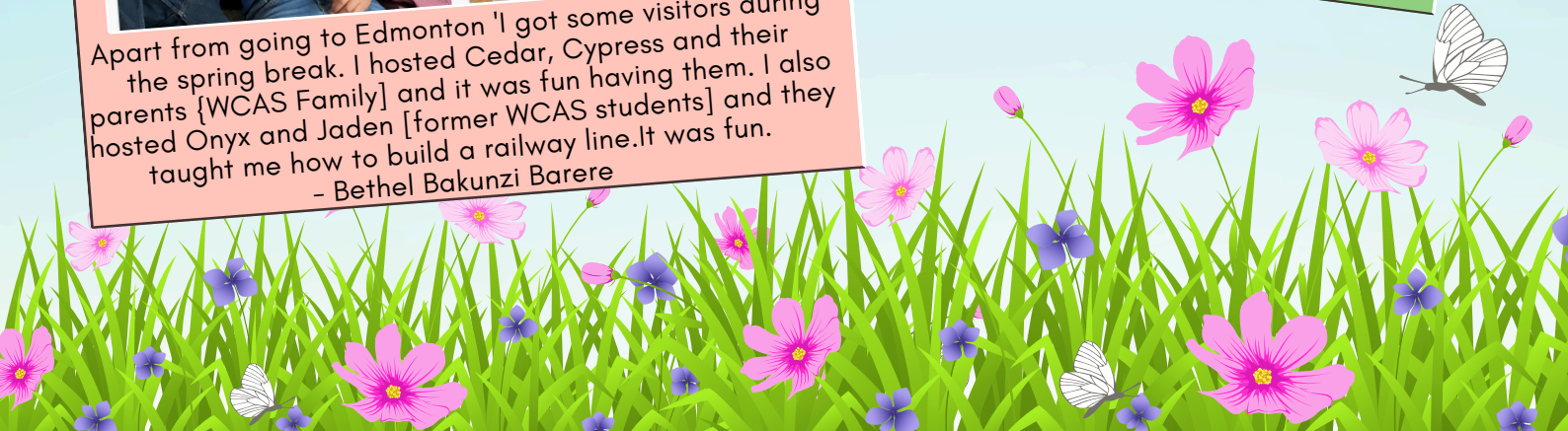
Spring Break?

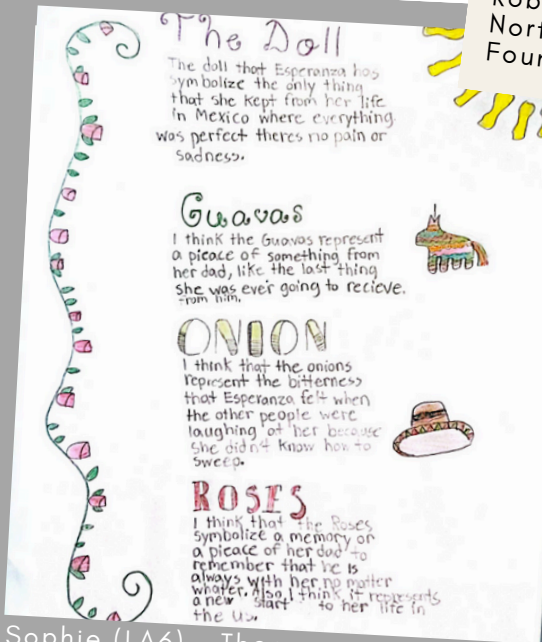

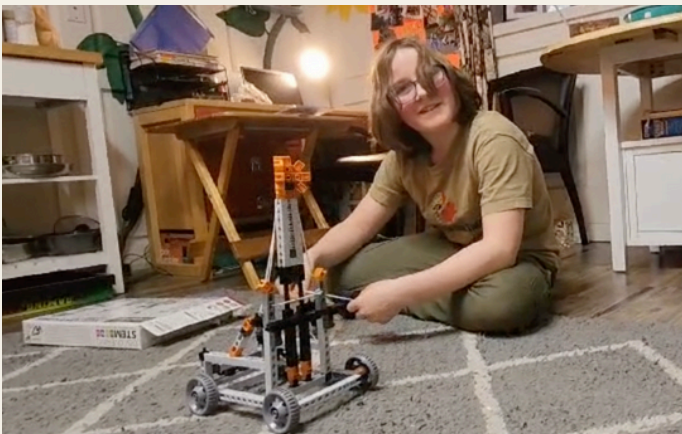

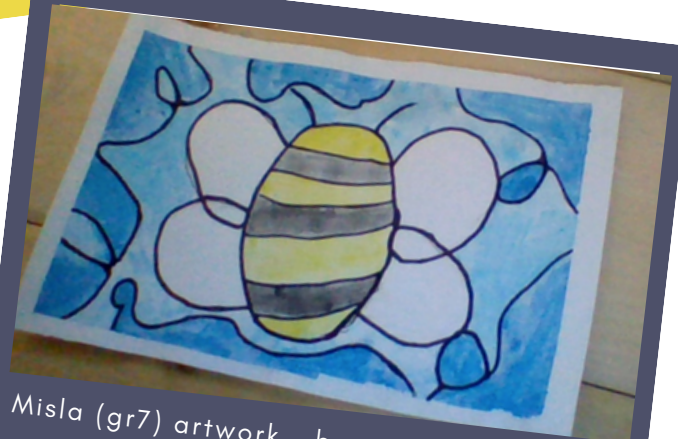

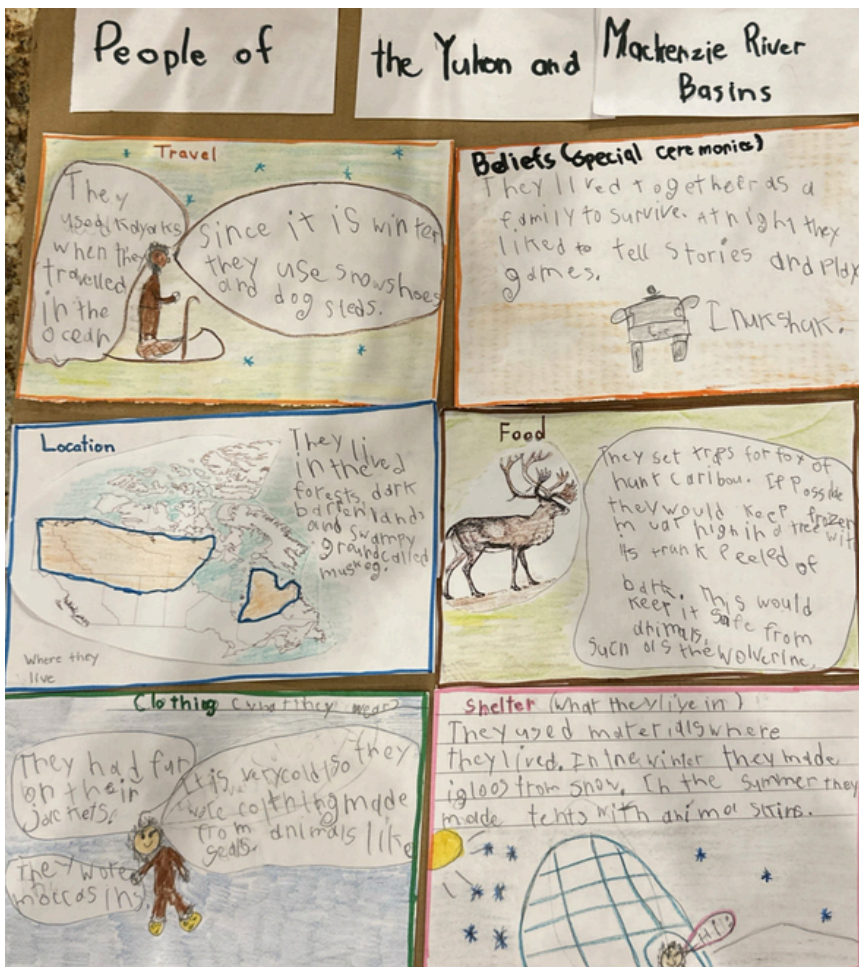

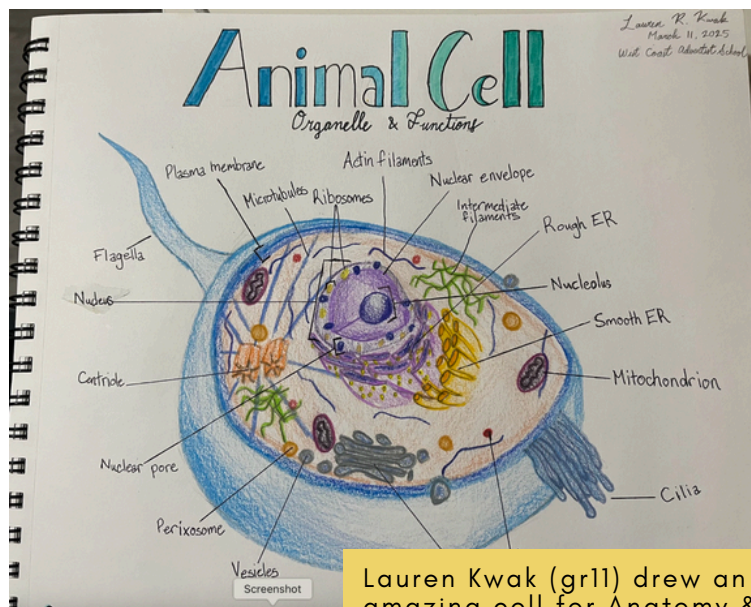

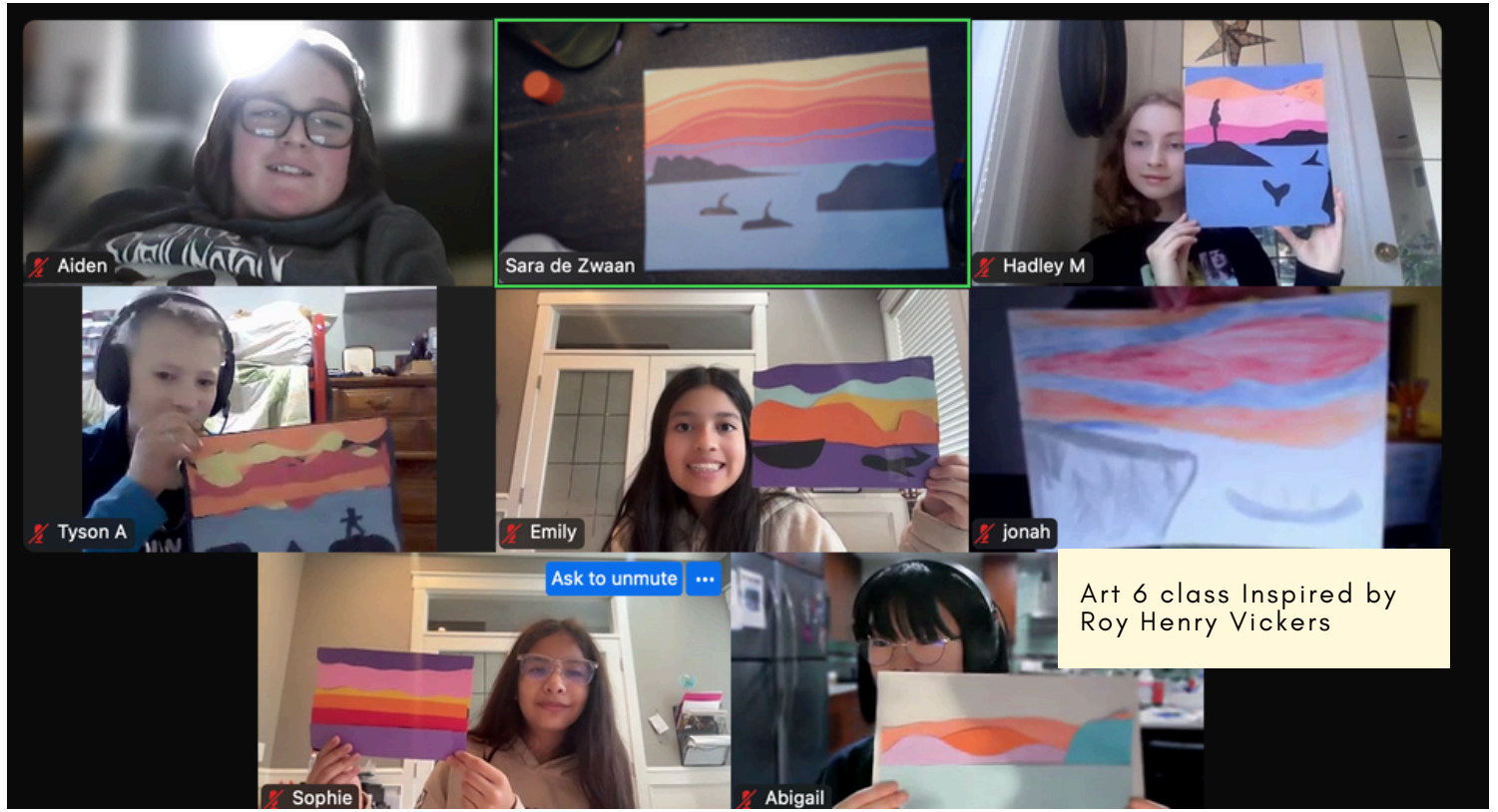
